- Destination Event:** The United Jewish Community of Broward County and the South Florida Holocaust survivors pay tribute to the six million and those who survived to bear witness. Dr. William Korey, a leading world authority on anti-Semitism and global human rights will discuss the increasing wave of anti-Semitism around the world.
Commences at 1:30 to 3:00 pm
- 3:15** Mount up and ride to restaurant location on way to Miami Beach.
- 3:45 - 4:00** Arrive at Restaurant - To Be Announced / Restaurant stop 1.5 hours
- 5:30** Group leaves for Miami Beach Holocaust Memorial Service
- Ride to Holocaust Memorial** King David Bikers mount up and ride to the Holocaust Memorial in Miami Beach. Address: 1933 Meridian Avenue. Bike parking across street from the Holocaust Memorial & the Miami Beach Convention Center
- Holocaust Memorial 6:30 - 7:30 PM** The Holocaust Memorial has an official program that includes the following: Remarks by General Consul of Israel, 82nd Airborne Division Color Guard, B'Nai Aviv Adult and Youth Choir, Reading's by Israeli Scouts, Inter-generational Candle Lighting Ceremony.
- 7:45 PM** King David Bikers Depart and head north, riders peel off as necessary.

About "Yom Hashorah V'Hagvura - Remembrance Day"

After the horrors of the Holocaust, Jews wanted a day to memorialize this tragedy. There is one day in the year when we make a special effort to remember (Zachor). On April 12, 1951, the Knesset (Israel's parliament) proclaimed Yom Hashoah U'Mered HaGetaot (Holocaust and Ghetto Revolt Remembrance Day) to be the 27th of Nissan. The name later became known as Yom Hashoah Ve Hagevurah (Devastation and Heroism Day) and later simplified to Yom Hashoah. In Israel, the Knesset made Yom Hashoah a national public holiday in 1959. Yom Hashoah has been observed with candle lighting, speakers, poems, prayers, and singing. Often, six candles are lighted to represent the six million. Holocaust survivors speak about their experiences or share in the readings. Some ceremonies have people read from the Book of Names for certain lengths of time in an effort of remembrance and to give an understanding of the huge number of victims. Sometimes these ceremonies are held in a cemetery or near a Holocaust memorial.
